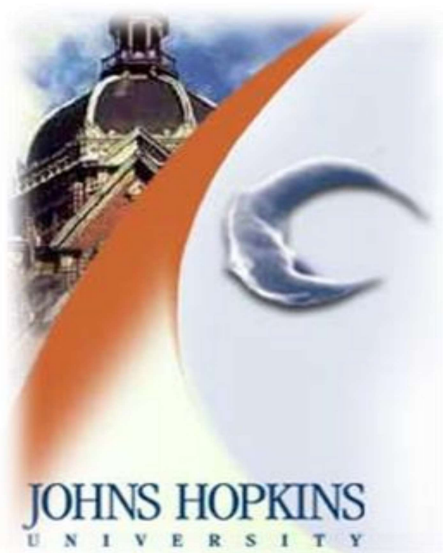

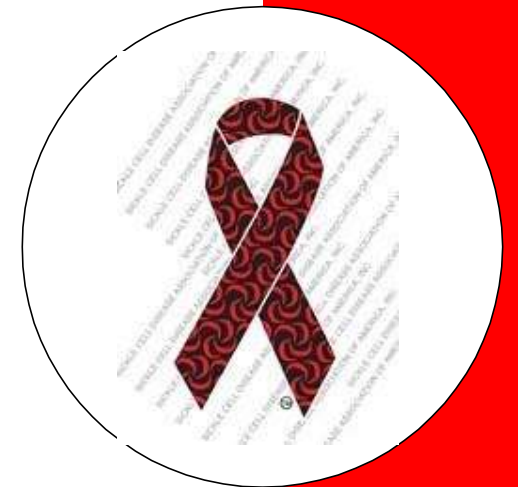
We offer social services such as: Sickle Cell Support Group, Coping Skills, Community Health Referrals, and other resources.

What is Sickle Cell Disease?

Sickle Cell Disease is an inherited disorder that is most commonly



found in people of African descent. In this disease hemoglobin, which is found in

red blood cells **and** is responsible for carrying oxygen throughout the body, is abnormal. This is a chronic disease that causes frequent painful episodes and often leads to long-term organ damage.

- Call or leave a voice message at 443 287-8288, opt. 2, to request an urgent appointment
- A nurse will contact you to discuss your immediate needs

Prescription Requests

To request prescription refills either:

1. Call **(443) 287-8288 (opt. 3)**: leave your name, date of birth, contact number, the prescription name and dosage, and designated pharmacy (name and address)

2. Request via **MyChart Medications Section**.

- Please allow 24 – 48 hours for processing
- Prescriptions are electronically filled and can be picked up at your designated pharmacy
- Please contact your designated pharmacy for prescription availability
